Dear Pastors and Commanders,

Greetings in the name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ! Enclosed is the informational packet for The Great Texas Pow Wow. The first time that all 3 Texas Districts have come together for one event. This year's Pow Wow will be held May 31 - June 3, 2007. The location will be Lakeview Camp of the Assemblies of God in Maypearl.

The Great Texas Pow Wow will be the first ever all Texas Royal Rangers campout for boys 9-17, as well as leaders. The boys will have a lot of fun during the day with all of the planned activities. However, the focus of Pow Wow is the spiritual emphasis each night during the council fire service and the other special devotions and services.

The registration fee is \$55.00 per person which includes food for the entire weekend, Thursday evening through breakfast Sunday. Gas, traveling expenses, etc. that your outpost will incur are at your discretion. You will need to determine the exact cost per person for your outpost to cover these additional charges if needed.

Remember: Physicals are recommended but not required for Pow Wow.

If you need help setting up camp, just let us know. We have men ready and available to assist your outpost. Pow Wow is for all Discovery Rangers (age 9 & up), Adventure Rangers, and Expedition Rangers, even if you are a relatively new outpost.

Join the staff in praying earnestly for God's anointing and the outpouring of the Holy Spirit. You and your boys will truly be blessed by this experience.

## **POW WOW WORKDAYS**

There are 2 work days scheduled for Pow Wow this year, March 24 and May 19. This is necessary due to all of the work that needs to be done and there's never enough time in one day to do it all.

March 24 will focus on facility clean up and new camp area clearing. There is much work to do around the pavilion, the pageant area, bath houses, etc. As the number of campers this year will be at an all time high, we also need to clear more camping areas. There is a lot of area to be used if we take the time to clear it out and make it ready. Workday will start at 8:00 from the lodge. Commander Dwain will be making assignments. This date will not be used to clear any specific campsites for the Pow Wow. May 19 will be the date for outpost cleaning of a Pow Wow campsite.

You will be able to come in the night before if necessary and camp to be ready to start Saturday morning.

The May 19 workday will be the time for clearing outpost campsites for Pow Wow. During the morning, everyone will be assisting in finishing the overall cleanup of the campground. Then, you will be ready to clear campsites. We ask that every outpost clear two campsites. The first one will be for a church that will be visiting during Pow Wow or not able to make it to workday. The second will be the campsite assigned to your outpost.

When you come to the workdays, please bring rakes, shovels, weed eaters, any tool you might use to help prepare the campground for this year's Pow Wow.

The camp is divided into seven areas. The campsites will have been assigned as the outposts registered within these seven areas. Assignments will be based on size of outpost and number of tents. Remember, there are no open fires or kitchens necessary as all meals will be provided. Staff Commanders will be assigned and responsible for area clean-up during work day and campsite coordination during the camp. Outposts will check in with those Commanders on arrival for campsite placement.

## **GREAT TEXAS POW WOW REGISTRATION**

Full payment must accompany the registration form. Registration after May 1 will be \$75/camper. If your outpost does not have all campers arrive at camp that are registered, you may receive a \$25 refund returned to the church after camp.**

# GENERAL POW WOW INFORMATION

These rules are designed to protect the health and safety of everyone at Pow Wow and to help everyone have an enjoyable time. Please help us by taking time to read and follow these guidelines. Remember that Pow Wow is designed for boys ages 9 – 17 and male leaders. All ladies and visitors are required to follow rule number 20 below. National Royal Rangers guidelines discourage taking boys 8 or younger on overnight campouts, and therefore we do not plan any activities for these boys.

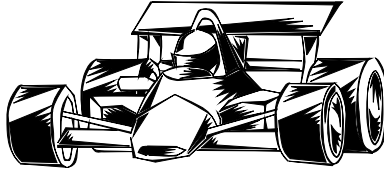
1. Emergency telephone number: 972-435-1828, Fax: 972-435-3039.
2. Please have your registration sheet filled out before arriving. Include the names of all boys and leaders who are attending – we need this information for insurance purposes.
3. Registration is open in the registration building from noon Thursday until midnight, and Friday at the Commanders' Lodge. The \$55 per person registration fee covers meals, patches, awards, prizes, speakers, insurance, restrooms, and other camp expenditures. **Everyone who camps on the premises or participates in the activities is expected to register and must wear the wristband that was issued to them during registration.**
4. Extra patches will be available for purchase beginning at 3:00 pm on Saturday at the Commanders Lodge.
5. The speed limit on all roads on the Lakeview Camp is **5 miles per hour**. This is for the safety of your boys. Please do not exceed this speed limit on any of the roads – this takes effect as soon as you leave the highway!
6. Do not allow your boys to ride in the back of a pick-up or on your trailer while in camp.
7. There will be **no** kitchens or open fires during this camp.
8. The water faucets are on the side of the restrooms, and other locations throughout the campsite. However, you must bring your own water containers.
9. There will be a concession stand, so boys and men may wish to bring extra money.
10. Please take out trash when you leave. There will not be a trash trailer or pickup.
11. Portable toilets will be provided for each general camp area. If your boys cannot make it to the restrooms, encourage them to use these rather than going in the woods.
12. DRESS CODE:
  - Morning assemblies** (including Sunday morning) — Class "B" uniform
  - Daytime games & activities** — Comfortable clothing (everyone must wear a shirt)
  - Evening pageants** — Khaki pants and Royal Rangers T-shirts
13. Fishing is **not** permitted during this camp at any time!

14. **PARKING:** No vehicles allowed in the camp areas. Each outpost will be expected to use the parking areas provided. Security will be working with campsites to ensure parking rules are followed. Failure to do so will result in continual visits from security staff and district staff as necessary. Vehicles will be allowed back in camp Sunday morning during breakfast for loading. There will be a tram service running to and from the parking lot to assist you when parking your car.
15. Security will be on duty at all hours for your safety and convenience. Please do not hesitate to call for them in case of an emergency or other serious needs. Most security will be in golf carts. Please instruct your boys to respect the requests of the security personnel.
16. There will be a medical technician (Paramedic) available at all times. The First Aid Station will be located at the First Aid building. If you need medical attention and cannot get the boy, leader, or visitor to the first aid building, notify security – they will be able to contact the first aid station. **Commanders: You are ultimately responsible for contacting a boy's parents if they end up at the hospital. This is not the responsibility of the First Aid Officers!** Please be sure to have the parental permission slips signed for taking any medication. Commanders are responsible for keeping the medical release forms for their boys. If the form is needed, the medical staff or security will get it from you.
17. Bring your outpost banners, flag, staffs, etc. and display them in a proper place for all to enjoy.
18. Your outpost should function as a group at all times. The commander is in charge of his boys and will be held responsible for their actions. Remember, Commanders, you need to know where your boys are and what they are doing!
19. "Lights out and quiet" is at 12 midnight. There should be no running about, loud talking, wood chopping or other obvious distracting noises after this time. Security will enforce this.
20. Visitors are welcome to the Pow Wow from 9 am – 4 pm and are welcome to attend the evening Pageant Services. Ladies are not allowed in the campsites. **All visitors must register at the registration booth and receive a wristband.** Failure to wear wristband will result in a request to leave the premises. We respectfully request that all visitors depart as quickly as possible after visitation hours, and that they respect the boy's and mens' right to privacy in their camps.
21. **NO** smoking will be allowed in the camp. If someone feels they must smoke, please do so in the parking lot where no boys can observe it.

**COMMANDERS PLEASE READ: You need to treat each boy and leader for chiggers as soon as you arrive and during the entire camp! The following come highly recommended in fighting chiggers: sulfur dust, sevin dust, off, avon skin so soft**

Chiggers have been one of our biggest problems in the past. Guest should protect themselves against chiggers also.

## Pinewood Derby Rules



- 1) All cars must be constructed from the materials contained within the Pinewood Derby kit. (You must use the nails, wheels, and wood parts provided in the kit). **Any car kit is acceptable because these cars can also be used for the All Texas Pow Wow with will use the Royal Rangers National Rules (same as Camporama)**
- 2) The overall length of the car cannot exceed 7 inches.
- 3) The overall width of the car cannot exceed 2 3/4 inches
- 4) The width of the car must not be less than 1 3/4 inches at the points where the axles are to be inserted.
- 5) The height of the car must not exceed 3 inches at any point.
- 6) Car ground clearance must be no less than 3/8 inches in order that clearance between the underside of the car and the guide rail of the racetrack is maintained. Do not place protruding weights, etc. on the underside of the car.
- 7) The maximum weight of a car is **5.5oz**. No loose materials of any kind are permitted. Any attached weight must be securely built into or onto the car. **Nothing may be taped to the car**. The weight of the cars will be checked at registration on our scales. The weight indicated by our scales is official.
- 8) The cars must operate on gravity only. No motors, rubber bands, springs, etc. are allowed.
- 9) No designs will be allowed that enables the front of the car to extend past the starting gate post. The middle front of each car is to be the longest point.
- 10) Washers and bearings are prohibited on wheels, as are solid axles.
- 11) Powdered graphite is the **ONLY** lubricant that can be used.
- 12) The cars shall not ride on any type of springs.
- 13) The car must be freewheeling, with no starting devices.
- 14) No loose materials of any kind (such as lead shot) are allowed on the car.
- 15) Besides light sanding on the surface of the wheels where they contact the track, you cannot in ANY way change the basic configuration of the wheels. They must look just as they did when the kit was purchased.
- 16) Details such as the steering wheel, driver decals, racing pipes, etc., are permissible as long as they do not exceed the maximum length, width, and weight specifications.
- 17) The Pinewood Derby Committee must inspect the car before it may compete. The committee has the right to disqualify any of the cars that do not meet these specifications. If a car fails inspection once, it will only be re-inspected one time.
- 18) Once a car passes inspection, it is placed in the pit area where only the commanders in charge of racing the cars are allowed to handle them. If this rule is broken, the car will be disqualified. If the car is damaged while racing or handling, repairs may be made in the pit area.
- 19) If a car leaves the track, runs out of its lane, interferes with another car, loses an axel, etc., the heat will be rerun. If the same car gets into trouble on the second run, the contestant is disqualified and automatically loses the race. If, on the second run, another car is interfered with, the heat will be rerun a third time but without the disqualifying car.

# Unlimited Class Rules

The previous rules apply with the following changes

- Overall length can be up to 9 inches
- Overall Height is 3 inches (to clear light at finish line)
- The maximum weight of a car is 7 oz
- Axles and wheels can be modified without limitations
- Any lubricant can be used

**Trophies:** Trophies will be awarded in the following areas:

- Fastest cars (Discovery Rangers, Adventure Rangers, Expedition Rangers, Commanders) Note! First, Second, and Third place trophies will be awarded in each division except the Adult/Commander category (First place only)
- Overall fastest car regular class – (Adult/Commander excluded)
- Fastest Unlimited Class car
- Most Patriotic, Most Aerodynamic, Best Vehicle Not a Car, Camp Commander’s Favorite (trophies and prizes will be awarded at the end of the races, prizes will be available for pickup if not present at time of awarding)



## Sportsmanship



Racing requires participants to learn two main things: the craft skills necessary to make your car and the rules that must be followed. There is also a third part to competition that’s very important-sportsmanship. This has to do with how you act and behave while participating in the derby.

The first thing to remember about sportsmanship is that everyone’s skills are a little different. Some people are better than others at certain skills. You may be good at one thing but not good at another. This doesn’t mean you are a good person one time and not good another time. You can always be a good person, whether or not you have good skills for racing. Remember, you and your friends are individuals first and racers second. This idea is sometimes called having respect for others.

The second thing to remember is to follow the rules. Without rules, there would be no pinewood derby. You will never know if you are really good at doing something unless you follow the rules. This is sometimes called being fair and being honest.

The third thing to remember about good sportsmanship is that there are winners and losers in every competition. You know this when you choose to compete. There are times when you will win and be happy, and times when you will lose and be unhappy. Being a good winner is easy but being a good loser is sometimes hard. To be a good sportsman, you must be able to say, “I did my best” and be satisfied with the results. If you win, you must not gloat.

## ***Summary of Key Information***

### **Cost**

The Great Texas Pow-Wow will cost \$55/camper pre-registered. Late registration will be \$75/camper. The registration will cover insurance costs, activity costs, patches, and this year it will cover all meals. Registration is due May 1.

### **Meals**

All meals will be provided for the campers from Thursday evening through Sunday morning. Meals will begin Thursday evening with a pizza meal welcoming you to the camp. The meals will be served in 30 minute intervals.

### **Activities**

Some of the activities available during the daytime: Shooting Sports—Archery, Riflery, Shotgun; Water Sports—Water slides, kayaking, canoeing; Pinewood Derby; FCF Battle re-enactment; Field games; special interest displays; and much, much, more. Discovery Rangers will have shooting sports on Friday. Adventure and Expedition Rangers will have shooting sports on Saturday. On Saturday, Expedition Rangers will have the opportunity to enjoy the challenge course. Permission slip included in this packet must be completed and accompany any Expedition Ranger wishing to get onto the challenge course.

### **FCF**

The largest FCF village ever assembled will be gathered from all districts. If you are an FCF member and wish to stay in the village, contact your FCF president. The village will display trades, have demonstrations, FCF games, and FCF traders will be available.

### **Campsites**

Campsites will be assigned as outposts register. There will be no need for kitchens in the campsites as all meals are provided. Due to the number of campers expected, no kitchens allowed in campsites. An outpost may maintain a cook stove and small supplies for snacks, cleaning, etc. No Chippewa kitchens, no camp trailers, etc. There will also be no open fires. All campsite space will be needed for tent space. Every outpost needs to identify their campsite in some manner, flags, standards, etc.

# 2007 Pow Wow

## 60 Hour Prayer Vigil

Prayer will be going on for the entire Pow Wow again this year. As in the past, we want God to have His way.

Since the Pow Wow is made of all three Texas districts, the scheduling of the prayer vigil will be different from those in prior years. Because all attendees will be camping in one of seven areas, this year's prayer vigil will be scheduled according to those seven areas. Each camp area commander is responsible for an 8 ½ hours span consisting of 8 time slots. Each prayer time slot is 65 minutes in length.

Here's how you can help.

Be faithful to your appointed time. Your camp area coordinator will schedule a time for the outposts to cover. Review your schedule for the time your camp area and outpost needs to be there. There are designated locations reserved for continual prayer. If you cannot be at the designated location for your appointed time, feel free to pray where you are. However, do not break the continuous 60-hour cycle. Boys' and commanders' souls are depending on your prayers.

Follow the agenda that is provided to assist those of you who think you cannot pray for an hour. You will be surprised how fast the hour will go by.

Let God direct you. You will be blessed beyond your imagination.

## **Swim Area**

## Showers and Restroom Use

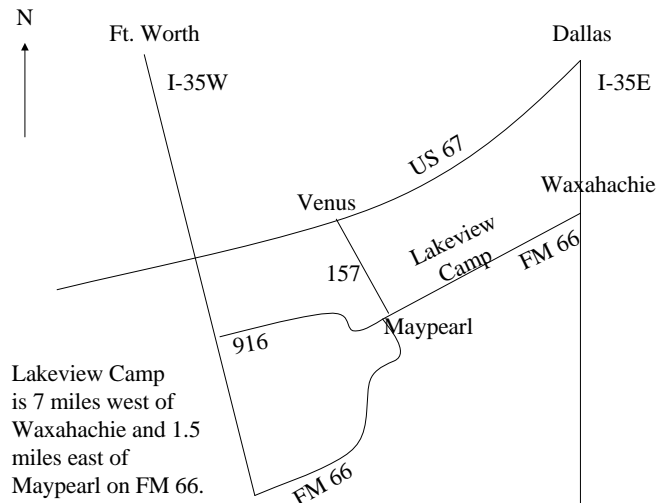

## Patrol Standards Judging Guidelines

1. **Design**
  - a. Patrol Standards should be designed by the patrol.
  - b. Commanders input should be minimal.
  - c. Physical size (excluding pole)
    1. Width should not be less than twelve inches nor more than thirty inches.
    2. Height should not be less than fifteen nor more than thirty inches.
  - d. Standard poles are to be from three to six feet in length.
2. **Art work**
  - a. Coloring and painting must be done by the patrol.
  - b. Letters or other appliques may be added by the patrol. If sewing is required, adult assistance or supervision is permitted.
  - c. Feathers, beads and other enhancements are encouraged.
  - d. Standard poles may be decorated also.
3. **Scoring**
  - a. Amount of work done by the patrol.
  - b. Overall appearance of the standard and the pole.
  - c. Additional points will be given if the entire patrol presenting the standard is wearing class B uniforms. Fewer but additional points will be given if the entire patrol presenting the standard is wearing class C uniforms and award vests.
  - d. An outpost may have more than one patrol in any age group.
4. **Judging**
  - a. Discovery, Adventure and Expedition Rangers will be judged separately.
  - b. A standard may not be used for more than one patrol.
  - c. First, second and third place ribbons will be given.
  - d. Decision of the district judging team is final.
